1. What does our privacy policy include?

3. What personal data do we collect and process?

Personal data is data that can identify you or that can be attributed to you otherwise.

When you contact us through this website, e.g. via a contact form on the website¹, or by sending us an e-mail, we collect the information you provide as well as the information provided by your device (name, email, IP address, etc.). we also process application documents that you submit to us in connection with a job application.

When using the website, the following data may also collected and stored in log files: IP address, date, time and duration of access, information about the operating system or browser used, URL of the website previously visited, name of the file accessed, amount of data transferred, device-specific information and other access data

4. How and for what purpose do we use your data?

We use your personal data to process your request. We base this on our legitimate interest in being able to respond to incoming requests. You are not required to provide personal data, but we may not be able to respond to your request if we do not receive sufficient information. In addition, we use data that we need for technical reasons for the operation and maintenance of our website and/or to prevent and detect illegal use of our website.

5. Do we share your data with third parties?

We do not sell or otherwise share your personal data with third parties unless we are required to do so by law, court order or governmental authority, or to enforce legal claims. Only for the maintenance and servicing of our IT systems, our IT service provider located in Switzerland may have access to certain personal data.

6. How do we protect your data?

Both us and our IT service provider use appropriate technical and organizational measures to protect your personal data from loss and unauthorized access. We review our security policies and procedures regularly to ensure that our systems are secure.

7. How long do we store your data?

We will retain your personal data for as long as it is necessary for the purposes for which it was collected, as long as we are obligated to do so by law or as long as we have a legitimate interest in storing it (e.g. for evidentiary purposes or IT security).

8. How do we use web analytics?

This website may use Google Analytics, a web analytics service provided by Google LLC ("Google"). Google Analytics uses "cookies", which are text files placed on your computer, to help the website analyse how users use the site. The information generated by the cookie about the use of this website by the users is usually transmitted to a Google server in the USA and stored there.

The IP address transmitted by your browser as part of Google Analytics will not be merged with other Google data. You may refuse the use of cookies by selecting the appropriate settings on your browser, however please note that if you do this you may not be able to use the full functionality of this website.
